2. How many states remained part of the Union?

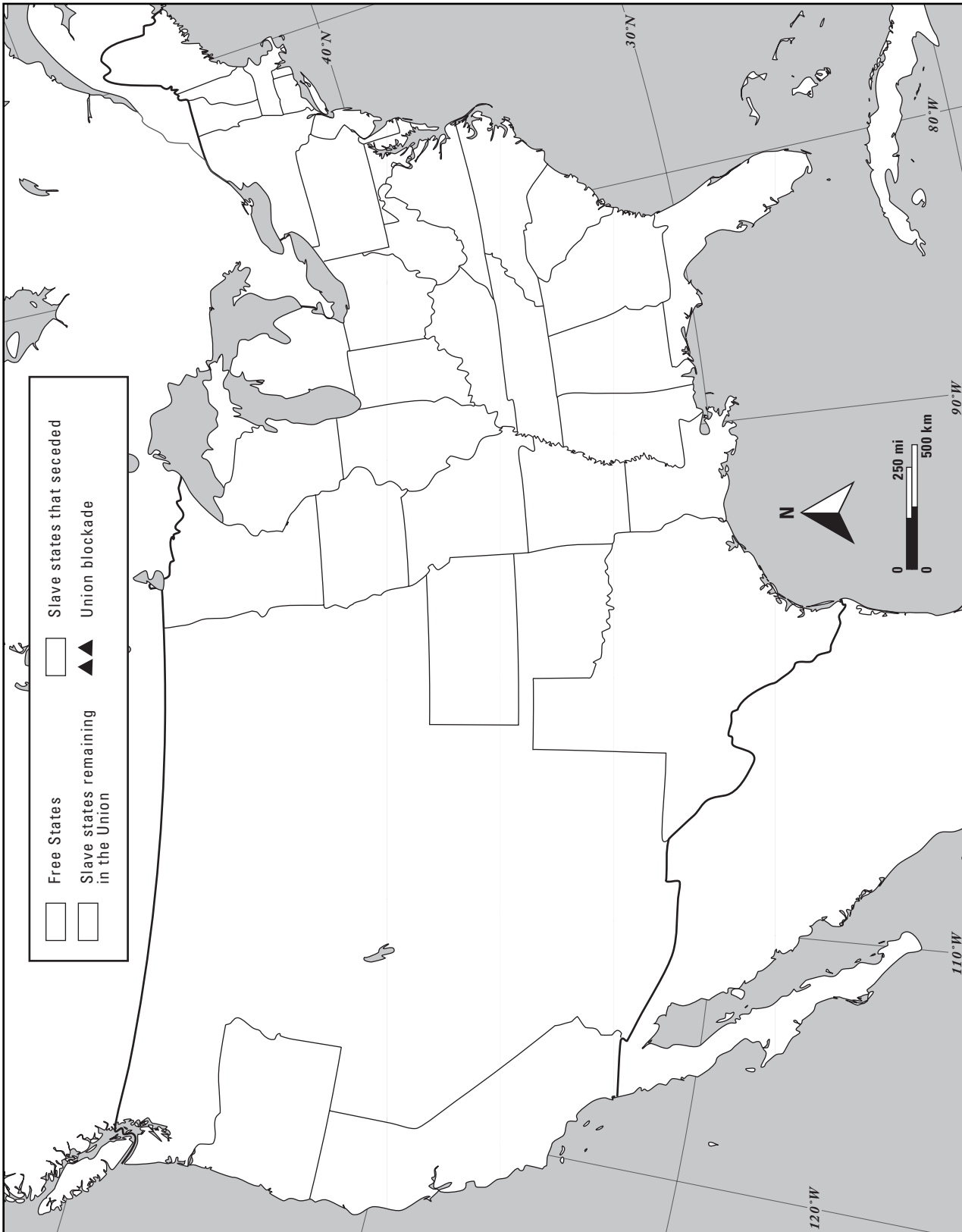
3. Which bodies of water did Union ships occupy as part of the Union blockade?
